Most recently, OCA led a national call for the Senate to confirm Bill Lann Lee as the Assistant Attorney General for Civil Rights in the Department of Justice. OCA also spearheaded efforts to hold the Energy Department accountable for its discriminatory actions toward its Chinese American scientists. Finally, OCA has been instrumental in building nationwide support for more protective national hate crimes legislation.

Assemblyman George Nakano is the first Asian Pacific American to represent Southern California in the Assembly in over a decade, bringing a breadth of community experience and public service to the State Capitol. *OCA salutes Assemblyman Nakano for his leadership in building community and legislative support for the establishment of Los Angeles' own Chinese American Museum.* To be housed in the 19th century Garnier Building in Old Chinatown, in the heart of downtown Los Angeles, the Chinese American Museum will, as a result of Assemblyman Nakano and Assemblyman Gil Cedillo's sponsorship of supporting legislation, serve as a cultural resource for Chinese Americans and all Americans for many generations to come.





Politically active for more than 30 years, Joe Hicks has been a community leader in efforts to combat hate crimes and work around constructing coalitions, alliances and cooperation between racial, ethnic and religious groups. Following the City's devastating riots in 1992, Mr. Hicks collaborated with a number of community leaders to found and later serve as the executive director of the Los Angeles MultiCultural Collaborative, a public interest organization dedicated to transcending racial and ethnic divisions. Mr. Hicks is currently the executive director of the Los Angeles City Human Relations Commission. Hicks has contributed regular commentary to the Los Angeles Times, Boston Globe, New York Times, Washington Post, "The Today Show," NBC, "Evening News," with Peter Jennings, and "Niteline," with Ted Koppel, ABC, and "Which Way L.A.," KCRW. OCA is pleased to bonor Joe Hicks for his unparalleled work in moving Los Angeles toward a new multicultural vision of society.



Having been interested in military history at a very young age, Montgomery Hom began to collect helmets and medals rather than baseball cards and comic books. His documentary, "We Served with Pride: The Chinese American Experience in World War II" is a culmination of 20 years of personal research and the collecting of WWII military artifacts.

Five years in the making, the film provides a powerful and insightful first-hand look into the lives of Chinese American veterans who participated in major battles overseas, as well as Chinese American civilians who worked on the home front, service organizations, and in defense work. Their untold stories, interwoven with period re-creations, original news footage and rare photos, bring to the screen a visually moving portrait of the Chinese American veteran experience.

Organization of Chinese Americans is proud to have been an instrumental force in bringing this important work to our nation's capitol to be premiered at the Museum of Natural History of the Smithsonian Institution in October. Phoebe Eng is a social activist, lawyer, and founding publisher of A. Magazine, now one of the leading publications dedicated to serving an Asian American readership. She is a national lecturer and director of a strategy group called The Different Mirror, which has advised the U.S. Department of Justice, the Ford Foundation, the Urban League, Fortune 500 companies, media and technology groups, and universities. Her bestseller, Warrior Lessons, is a luminous roadmap across the uncharted territory of Asian American women's lives, through moments of anger and epiphany to reconciliation and empowerment in a racially-sensitized society.

The son of Chinese immigrants, the Hon. Ronald S.W. Lew has been a trailblazer in our community, receiving numerous accolades through the decades. Most recently, Judge Lew was awarded the prestigious "Person of the Year" Award by the Metropolitan Daily News. Judge Lew is a strong supporter of OCA and of our community. As president of the Friends of the Chinese American Museum, Judge Lew has been instrumental in championing the capital campaign to permanently house the Society's many historical artifacts in a permanent home - the historical Garnier Building in Old Chinatown.



JOHN CHIANG STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

As a member of the State Board of Equalization, the Honorable John Chiang is the highest ranking elected Asian Pacific American official in the state of California. Prior to serving as an elected official, he worked for several noted political leaders, including Gray Davis and Congressman Brad Sherman. Not only is he a member of the board of directors of Planned Parenthood Los Angeles but he has also served as a volunteer attorney for the Los Angeles County Bar Association Hospice AIDs Project; an Advisory Council Member of Big Sisters of Los Angeles; and a member of the Regional Interview Panel for the White House Fellowship Program.



KIRK TANIOKA DIVISION MANAGER, UNITED PARCEL SERVICE

Kirk Tanioka joined United Parcel Service over 32 years ago and advanced through the ranks in both Staff and Operations assignments to become the Division Manager of the Main Street facility, located in the outskirts of Los Angeles Chinatown. 
