

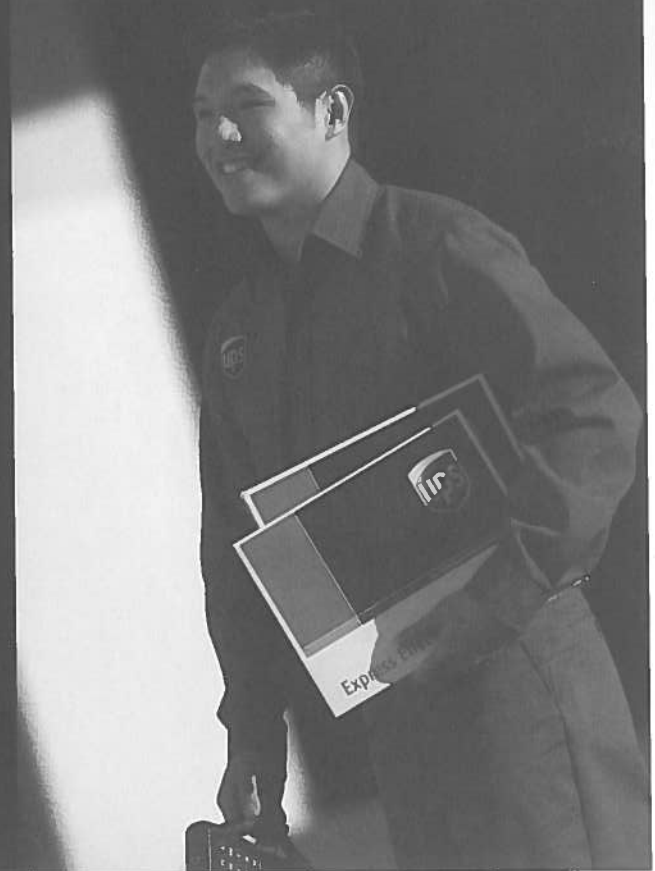

EMCEE & PRESENTERS



Kyung Lah is a general assignment reporter for the award-winning Channel 4 News. Prior to her joining KNBC in May 2003, Lah worked for WBBM-TV in Chicago and KGTV in San Diego, California. Lah began her career as a reporter/anchor for WDWS-AM/WHMS-FM in Champaign, Illinois after graduating from the University of Illinois with a Bachelor's Degree in Broadcast Journalism. Lah has won a number of prestigious awards for her work including a local area Emmy Award for an investigative story she did on the Mexican government allowing Mitsubishi to build a salt plant in an environmentally protected world heritage site. She also won an Associated Press Award for best spot news and best investigative story, and an award from the Society of Professional Journalists for best criminal justice reporting for her news piece on a wrongly imprisoned suspect. Lah is active in the Asian American Journalists Association.



Leo Chu is Vice President of Creative Affairs for Walt Disney Feature Animation. He is responsible for the development and production of feature films produced at Disney's California, Florida, and Paris studios from their inception through to their theatrical release. Chu is the first Asian American in a creative leadership role at the Walt Disney Studios. His films include such international hits as MULAN, TOY STORY, DINOSAUR, ATLANTIS, LILO & STITCH and the award-winning Japanese masterpiece, SPIRITED AWAY. In addition to his film duties, Chu produces the prestigious ASCAP/Disney Musical Theater Workshop, which is designed to help young songwriters hone the craft of writing specifically for the musical theater. Chu has been featured as one of the "Top Ten Young Hollywood Players" by *Yolk Magazine* and "Top 10 Most Influential Minorities in Entertainment" by *Entertainment Weekly*. Chu was also the 2002 OCA-GLA Image Award recipient for Artistic Achievement.



Dr. Dunson Cheng is Chairman and CEO of Cathay Bank. Dr. Cheng, originally from Hong Kong, holds a B.S. in Applied Math and Physics from the University of Wisconsin and a Ph.D. in Physics from Stony Brook, New York State University. Cheng serves on the boards of Tsinghua University (Beijing), Education Foundation (Northern California), National Association of Chinese American Bankers, DiCon Fiberoptics, Inc., Los Angeles World Affairs Council and Los Angeles-Guangzhou Sister City Association.

Founded in 1962, Cathay Bank was the first Chinese American bank to serve the Chinese American community in California. Its total assets are approximately \$3 billion as of June 30, 2003 with 20 branches throughout California, 3 in New York, 1 in Texas, and several overseas offices. It has maintained a long-standing commitment to investing in underserved Asian American and immigrant communities, by supporting affordable housing development and contributing to a wide range of community services and events.



Heidi Shyu is Vice President of the Unmanned & Reconnaissance Systems Department at Raytheon. Shyu has been working at Raytheon for the past 10 years and is one of the highest ranking women at Raytheon. Her area of expertise is technology planning and development of antenna technologies, low observable technology, active array radar systems, electronic counter-counter measures (ECCM) algorithm development, electronic self-defense systems, detection, and tracking of radar systems. Shyu holds a Master of Science in Mathematics from the University of Toronto, Canada and a Master of Science in Electrical Engineering from the University of California at Los Angeles. She also serves on the Air Force Scientific Advisory Board as their Vice-Chairman.

JUSTIN LIN, "BETTER LUCK TOMORROW"

ARTISTIC ACHIEVEMENT



Writer, director, producer and editor Justin Lin is best known for his critically acclaimed and audience hit film BETTER LUCK TOMORROW. The film made box office history as the highest grossing per screen average opening weekend film for Paramount Classics and MTV Films when it was released in April, 2003. Recently named one of VARIETY'S TOP 10 FILMMAKERS TO WATCH, Lin holds a BA and MFA in film directing from the UCLA School of Film and Television.

Early in his career, Lin served as the Production Coordinator of the Media Arts Center for the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles. He produced, directed and edited several multi-media projects and educational television pilots. Lin co-wrote, directed and edited his first feature film - the critically acclaimed *Shopping for Fangs*, which screened internationally in numerous festivals including the Palm Springs International Film Festival and Toronto International Film Festival. Lin has established his own production company called TRAILING JOHNSON PRODUCTIONS and is reviewing potential new projects for development, while working on a documentary about a Las Vegas lounge act entitled *Spotlighting*. In July 2003, Justin Lin was named the "IT AUTEUR" on The Entertainment Weekly IT List - The 100 Most Creative People in Entertainment by the publication Entertainment Weekly.

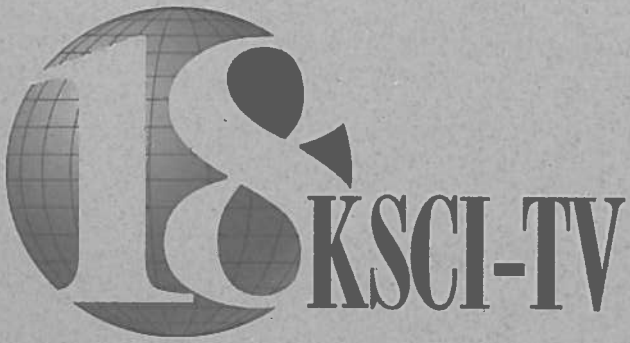

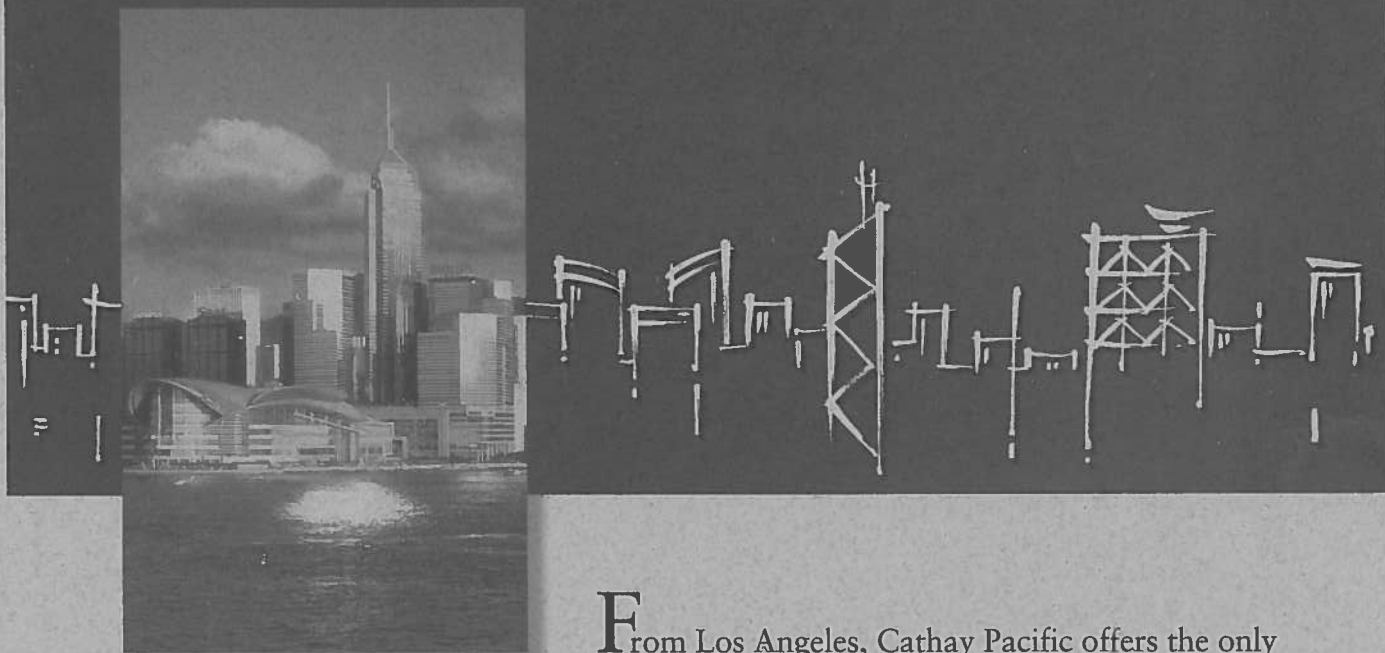
