Founded in 1973 as the Organization of Chinese Americans, OCA aims to embrace the hopes and aspirations of nearly 13 million Asian Pacific Americans in the United States.

OCA is engaged in organizing its more than 80 chapters and college affiliates across the nation to develop both leadership and community involvement. OCA chapters and our college affiliates are establishing strong local programs in all parts of the country.

OCA's base in Washington, D.C. gives the national office an effective vantage point for monitoring legislation and policy issues affecting Asian Pacific Americans. In addition, OCA is able to build national support and to work in coalition with other national groups around issues affecting Asian Pacific Americans.

OCA takes no collective position on the politics of any foreign country, but instead focuses on the welfare and civil rights of Asian Pacific Americans in the United States.

Adeline M.L. Yoong



Adeline M.L. Yoong is the founding chapter president of the Organization of Chinese Americans, Greater Los Angeles and had served for 6 years on the nationally elected OCA Executive Council. Ms. Yoong has more than 25 years of experience in the field of marketing and public affairs. She is the Government Affairs Manager at the Water Replenishment District of Southern California (WRD), a regional groundwater management agency for over 10% of this state's population. Ms. Yoong also currently serves on the Ford Theatre Foundation Board. Her involvement with the Asian and Pacific Islander community includes service on the boards of community-based organizations such as the Center for Pacific Asian Family (CPAF) and APIA Votel. Ms. Yoong holds an M.B.A. in Marketing from the University of San Francisco and a B.A. in Psychology and a minor in Women's Studies from Carleton College.



Sam Luk

Sam Luk is a Senior Architect with the State of California. Since joining OCA to help revitalize the Greater Los Angeles chapter in 1991, Mr. Luk has remained steadfast in his commitment to OCA. He served on the chapter's Board in different capacities, including as Chapter President. Nationally, Mr. Luk served on the OCA National Executive Council as Executive Vice President (2003-2004), National Secretary (2001-2002), and Vice President of Chapter Development (1997-2000). He also was a key member in helping to launch the OCA Building Fund Campaign, which eventually lead to the current OCA National Center in Washington, DC. Several years ago, Mr. Luk agreed to be an inaugural member of the chapter's Community Executive Committee (CEC). He has never missed an Image Awards, which is OCA-GLA's largest fundraiser. He is currently the president of the LAMP Optimist International in Monterey Park, a non-profit group dedicating to serving the youth and is the former president of the Monterey Park Toastmaster International.



Kathay Feng

Kathay Feng is the Executive Director of California Common Cause. Under Ms. Feng, California Common Cause has taken a leadership role in election and redistricting reform, government sunshine and accountability laws, campaign finance reform, media access, and championing the voting rights of traditionally disenfranchised communities. Prior to joining Common Cause, Ms. Feng directed the Voting Rights and Hate Crimes at the Asian Pacific American Legal Center (APALC), where she worked in a variety of civil rights areas including voting rights and redistricting, hate crimes, police accountability, and anti-discrimination law. Ms. Feng also founded the California Voter Empowerment Circle (CalVEC, www.calvec.org), a coalition of 50 organizations throughout the state, to improve state and local election policies and practices, particularly to address barriers facing for traditionally disenfranchised communities. Having graduated from Cornell University, she went on to earn her JD from UCLA School of Law.

Honorees

Community Achievement



Suellen Cheng & Dr. Munson Kwok have been honored for many of their efforts to promote Chinese American history and their involvement in the Chinese American and other communities. Between 1998 and 2000, Suellen & Munson were the Executive Producers of a traveling exhibit, Heading East: Californian Asian Pacific American Experiences, a traveling exhibit that celebrated California's sesquicentennial. They received the prestigious KCET "Local Hero" award for their work in preserving Chinese American culture and history and the Mathews award of City Historical Society, and the Peace and Justice Award of UCLA's Asian American Studies Center. They

were both awarded together the UCLA Asian American Studies Center's Peace & Justice Award, the KCET Local Hero of Year award, and Miriam Matthews Award from Los Angeles City Historical Society, Chinatown Public Safety Association and Chinese American Citizens Alliance for their work as a team on their community works.

Suellen Cheng is a curator and Museum Director at El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historical Monument. She received a M.A. in American Studies at Tamkang University, Taiwan, Republic of China. For over 30 years, Suellen Cheng has been working for the recognition and advancement of Chinese Americans in California. She has been one of the leading developers of the Friends of the Chinese American Museum at El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historical Monument. She enjoys working as community volunteer and has served on many organizations including the Chinese American Citizens Alliance, Chinese Historical Society of Southern California, Los Angeles City Historical Society, Friends of Chinatown Library, and Las Angelitas del Pueblo. She has also received special recognitions from the City of Los Angeles, Los Angeles Central City Optimist Club and Los Angeles Chinese Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Munson Arthur Kwok received his Bachelor of Science, Master of Science and Ph.D. from Stanford University and has been an aerospace engineer, physicist, and systems engineer for over 40 years, working in research and space acquisition at the Aerospace Corporation. Dr. Kwok has authored and coauthored over 65 publications, presentations, and reports. Among the many professional honors he has received include the Asian Pacific American of the Year (The Aerospace Corporation) and Contractor Employee of Quarter (1Q, 2010) from MDA Missile Defense Group. While he was president of the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California, he helped found the Chinese American Museum (then known as the Museum of Chinese American History). Today, he is Second Vice President, Development, of the Chinese American Museum and is currently on the KCET Community Advisory Board. He recently received the Golden Spike Award for community service from Chinese Historical Society of Southern California and received the California Assembly's Day of Inclusion Award and Outstanding Community Service Award from LA County Asian American Employees Association.

Excellence in Media



Phil Yu is the founder and editor of AngryAsianMan.com, a popular Asian American news/culture blog. Building a steady, loyal readership since 2001, AngryAsianMan.com has been praised by the Washington Post as "a daily must-read for the media-savvy, socially conscious, pop-cultured Asian American." Mixing humor with criticism, Phil's commentary has been featured and quoted in stories for the Post, New York Times, National Public Radio, CNN, Los Angeles Times and more. He also appears on the November 2010 cover of KoreAm Journal. He worked previously at the Center for Asian American Media in San Francisco, and currently serves on the Board of Visual Communications and Projekt Newspeak, both in Los Angeles. Phil graduated with a B.S. in Radio/TV/Film from Northwestern University, and earned his M.A. in Critical Studies as a Provost Fellow from the University of Southern California's School of Cinema-Television.

Artistic Achievement Award

Far East Movement (also known as FM) creates music that bridges the gap between underground party records and mainstream pop music. They take elements of hip-hop, electro, alternative and dance to create an original pop sound and lifestyle they refer to as 'Free Wired'.

Kev Nish, Prohgress, J-Splif, and DJ Virman have taken the Los Angeles club scene global with world tours, national song placements on television and film and a #1 hit song (Girls On The Dance Floor) on Los Angeles radio all before they dropped their debut album, Free Wired, in October 2010.



The album's lead single, "Like A G6," instantly exploded on radio and sales charts, reaching triple platinum-plus status and the top spot on Billboard's Hot 100 chart making them the first Asian-American group with a #1 song in the country. "Rocketeer," the second single, took similar flight and became another platinum selling Top 10 Billboard charting that connected with new fans of all ages. "Like A G6" took home Top Pop Song of the year from ASCAP and was nominated for a 2011 Billboard Award for Top Rap Song.

Corporate Achievement
